ABRAHAM - The Principle of \_\_\_\_\_

He is the father of us all. Rom. 4:16

What is FAITH?

Now faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see. Heb. 11:1

And *without faith it is impossible to please God*, because anyone who comes to him *must believe that he exists* and that *he rewards those who earnestly seek him*. Heb. 11:6

SO HOW DO YOU MAKE YOUR FAITH STRONGER?

1. \_\_\_\_\_ WITHOUT FULLY \_\_\_\_\_

The Lord had said to Abram, <u>"Leave your country</u>, your people and your father's household and go to the land I will show you. Gen.12:1

By faith Abraham, <u>when called to go</u> to a place he would later receive as his inheritance, <u>obeyed</u> <u>and went</u>, even though <u>he did not know where</u> he was going. Heb. 11:8

2. \_\_\_\_\_ WHEN THE ANSWER IS \_\_\_\_\_

And Abram said, "You have given me no children; so a servant in my household will be my heir." Then the word of the Lord came to him: "This man will not be your heir, <u>but a son coming from</u> <u>your own body will be your heir.</u>" He took him outside and said, <u>"Look up at the heavens and</u> <u>count the stars</u>—if indeed you can count them." Then he said to him, "So shall your offspring be." Gen. 15:3-5

Abram *believed the Lord*, and he credited it to him as righteousness. Gen. 15:6

By faith Abraham, even though he was past age—and Sarah herself was barren—was enabled to become a father because he considered him faithful who had made the promise. Heb. 11:11

3. BE WILLING \_\_\_\_\_\_ WHAT YOU \_\_\_\_\_\_

Some time later **God tested Abraham.** He said to him, "Abraham!" "Here I am," he replied. Then God said, <u>"**Take your son, your only son, Isaac, whom you love,**</u> and go to the region of Moriah. <u>**Sacrifice him there as a burnt offering**</u> on one of the mountains I will tell you about." Gen. 22:1-2

By faith Abraham, <u>when God tested him</u>, offered Isaac as a sacrifice. He who had received the promises <u>was about to sacrifice his one and only son</u>, even though God had said to him, "It is through Isaac that your offspring will be reckoned."

Abraham <u>reasoned that God could raise the dead</u>, and figuratively speaking, he did receive Isaac back from death. Heb. 11:17-19
